Free Family Fun for Youth and Scouts of all ages

The Fort Knox Scouting Community will hold its 4th Annual Future Leader's Day (FLD05) at Fort Knox on 6 AUG 05. This event is open to ALL members of the surrounding community (to include all of the United States, and the World), as well as the Scouting, and Fort Knox community. Youth of all ages are the focus of this event, since they are the future leaders of the nation. This event will afford Scouts the opportunity to complete work toward badges, pins, and achievements, and will afford ALL youth an opportunity to try new things, learn something, and have FUN.

As is tradition, this is a **FREE EVENT**. There is no registration fee, admission fee, or required donation. Camping & patches, however, are not free. All we ask, is that if you are a Pack, Crew, Post, or Troop, that you help out by trying to bring an activity / event / display / demonstration / exhibition. If camping, please pre-register. If Your unit is attending the BSA National Jamboree, be sure to stop off with us on your way back home.

Prepared for the Future

Many BSA units will be on the trail home from the National Jamboree, if you unit is, you should stop off and camp with us on your return route! FLD is similar to a fair during which there are activities, exhibits, and booths for our Future Leaders. Its also similar to the BSA Council's Scout-O-Rama, or the GSUSA Council's Festival of the Arts. This years theme is "Prepared for the Future". The events at FLD05 are open to **ALL** youth (not just scouts) and their families. We hope that this year we reach a much broader target market than just the surrounding areas, we also hope to draw boys, girls and their families from other locations in Kentucky, as well as surrounding states.

We'd like to coordinate with Scout units, and Community organizations to also provide information / education booths or FUN Scout related / achievement producing booths. We will need your help to offer some GREAT SCOUT booths!!! **ANY scouting units can offer achievement producing / activity booths.** These booths will offer an activity corresponding with a task or requirement for a particular level and branch of scouting. An example could be a Cub Scout booth to earn the Art Beltloop, or a Brownie booth to teach what to do when clothes catch on fire, counting toward a Try-It, or a Cadette booth for the Emergency Preparedness IP, or a Boy Scout booth to learn to communicate using Morse Code or signal flags). Of course these booths would be open to **ALL** youth to participate in.

The goal would be for all Youth participating in events to receive a slip of paper stating that they have qualified at the booth. The idea behind this is that:

- Girl, Boy, and Cub Scouts could take this document to their pack or troop to be honored.
- If a child is not a scout, but joins scouting that day, they may take this document to their new unit to be honored.

We would like for your Unit or community organization to come out and have fun with us, and whether a Girl Scout, Venturer, Cub Scout, Explorer, or Boy Scout **an Event Patch will be available.**

RULES & INFO

1. This is a Military Reservation, and Safety is always first. Please stay away from areas marked as **UNAUTHORIZED AREAS**.
2. Only Scout units will be allowed to camp on site. (contact us if other than a BSA/GSUSA unit) All campsites must be attended by a responsible adult.
3. 2 unit equipment vehicles will be allowed to enter the camping areas on Friday night. All other vehicles must stay in the parking areas. All equipment carrying vehicles must download equipment and move to the parking areas on Friday Night after unloading. They may make multiple trips.
4. Trailers will be allowed to remain in the unit camping area until departure on Sunday.
5. Water is available, but each unit is requested to bring one gallon of water per person when camping.
6. No unit will be allowed to camp without the appropriate adult leadership, as set forth by the BSA or GSUSA or other higher headquarters. Girl Scout adult must have Level III training.
7. All units will do their own cooking/heating of food and water with charcoal, wood, or approved liquid fuel method. Open fires must be contained and above the ground – **NO DIGGING, NO GROUND FIRES.** No wood is available on site for cooking or scoutcraft. All liquid fuels must be properly stored and maintained.
8. All units must pack their own trash out of the event site.
9. Camping sites on the FLD event site will be assigned upon arrival on Friday night on a first-come, first-served basis. Size of the site will be based on the size of the unit. Additional camping is available at Camp Carlson.
10. Official GSUSA camping will be located at a separate camping area than the BSA camping.
11. Girl Scouts are welcome to participate as families or with their Troop. However, GSUSA troops attending 'officially' as a troop function must be aware of the restrictions placed upon them by the GSUSA and their council. Liability for Girl Scouts who are attending under the supervision of their parents as opposed to the supervision of their troop leader, rests on the parent.
12. The official Scout uniform for your National organization will be worn on Saturday during the main events. At other times a scout T-shirt should be worn. Scouts should use the buddy system, or be under the control of an adult
13. Event Patches are not free, but can be purchased at the event.
14. We have limited slots for the SLT SIMEX – **REGISTER EARLY** – all scout units will be in the scout bracket, and can not enter in the other brackets. Scouts under the age of 13 who want to participate on a SIMEX team, must have a signed permission slip from their parent.

FLD05 Additional Post Activities

◆ **Scout Shotgun Orientation – French Range Shooting Club** is offering a program which will orient a scout (male & female, ages 11 & up) to the operation of a shotgun. Participants will be under the instruction of the Range Officials, and will fire on a Trap and Skeet range. Each group will need to plan on this event taking approximately 2.5 hours out of their day on Saturday; Max per group is 6. The event will be offered between the hours of 1000 – 1700 (5:00pm), and a new group will start every 30min. Each group will be given their start time upon arrival at FLD, and it is the responsibility of the unit to make sure that their scouts are transported to and from French Range, and that they arrive at least 5 minutes prior to the start time of their group. Cost per participant is \$5.00.* Pre-registration required. This is not an approved Girl Scout activity, Participating "Troops" cannot attend (See RULES & INFO #11).

◆ **Water Park** – The Fort Knox Waterpark is offering a special FLD05 rate for Scouts. The Park is open Sat. 6 AUG from 1100 – 1900 (7:00p.m.) and



Scouts who wish to make the park a part of their FLD05 adventure, can gain admission for \$2.00* per person (50% off). A great activity after the heat and the main events of the day in Keyes park. The Water Park offers a 25 meter pool with zero depth entry, a 70-foot tube slide, a 70 foot open slide, a giant water cascading mushroom, water spouts, and a water challenge course with floating logs and lily pads. There is an enclosed wading pool and playground for toddler fun. Changing rooms and lockers are available. Units do not have to pre-register for this event, but will need to prove membership in a scouting unit (as a leader or scout) through membership card or uniform.

◆ **Patton Museum**

Open until 1630 (4:30p.m.) on Friday, and 1800 (6:00 p.m.) on Saturday, the Patton Museum is an event that all scout units Should make sure that they attend. Admission is Free, so make a trip through the museum, and its outdoor exhibits as well!



◆ **Scout Golfing*** – Not interested in Swimming? The post Golf course is offering a Scout Discount for those not interested in going to the Water Park Saturday evening.

◆ **Scout Bowling*** – The Post Bowling Alley is also offering a Scout Rate of \$1.50 & free shoe rental, for those interested in bowling a few games on Saturday evening or Sunday after 1200.
